Suggestions:

1. In most cases you will be hunting with one other hunter at the farm, leaving your blind may interfere with the other hunter, therefore do not leave your assigned blind without first checking with the other hunter or the lessor.
2. All hunters must plan to arrive at the farm the day before your hunt so that we may show you around and you can pick out the blind that you want to hunt in.
3. **If available**, you may use one of our golf carts to get to and from your blind or you may drive your personal vehicle.
4. You should plan to be in your assigned hunting blind no later than six o'clock (6:00 am) as is generally light enough to shoot by 6:30 am.
5. The only camo that is necessary: Gloves and a Face mask, a dark colored or camo shirt, be sure that there are no openings behind you in the blind (no silhouette).
6. Sit quietly in the blind move only as absolutely necessary, Turkeys can see the slightest movement and hear the slightest noise. And remember there may be ten (10) birds in front of you that twenty (20) eyes looking around.
7. Hunters staying in the fifth wheel trailer at the farm must vacate the trailer by noon on the last day of the lease.
8. No cooked meals are provided for hunters at the farm by the lessor; however, the lessor shall provide a "packaged lunch" to be taken to the hunting blind, cold drinks and water & ice is provided.
9. AGAIN, you should plan to arrive at our farm around 3:00 pm the day prior to your hunt to look at the blinds.

Do not leave anything in the woods except your footprints; everything you take into the woods comes out of the woods with you.
